The Guide provides an overview of each program and sets out who is eligible to receive funding, the maximum amounts payable and information on where to make an application. However, prospective applicants are strongly advised to contact the appropriate department to obtain complete details about the specifics of the program before making an application.

This Guide is published annually by the Cabinet Secretariat, Department of Executive, Government of the Northwest Territories. It is distributed to all departments, libraries and the offices of some non-government agencies. It is also available on the Government of the Northwest Territories' website at www.gov.nt.ca.

Special Event Funding to Aboriginal Organizations

Purpose

To provide funding to territorial, regional and/or community Aboriginal organizations to supplement the costs of annual general assemblies, special assemblies, the public celebration of National Aboriginal Day, and other special events as approved from time to time by the Minister.

Eligibility

- (a) for the purposes of annual or special assemblies, the following territorial and regional Aboriginal organizations are eligible:
- Inuvialuit Regional Corporation
 - Dene Nation
 - Gwich'in Tribal Council
 - Sahtu Secretariat Incorporated
 - Dogrib Treaty 11 Council
 - Deh Cho First Nations
 - Akaitcho Dene First Nations
 - North Slave Metis Alliance
 - Northwest Territories Metis Nation
 - Native Women's Association
 - As approved by the Minister, other Aboriginal organizations, duly registered and in good standing under the *Societies Act*.
- (b) for the purposes of National Aboriginal Day, community Aboriginal organizations that represent the political, social and cultural interests of their members that are duly registered and in good standing under the *Societies Act*.

- (c) for the purposes of other special events, as approved from time to time by the Minister, those organizations listed under (a) and referred to under (b).

Amount

- (a) not exceeding \$5,000 to each eligible territorial or regional Aboriginal organization to supplement the costs of annual or special assemblies; and
- (b) not exceeding \$1,000 to each eligible community Aboriginal organization for public celebration of National Aboriginal Day.

Core Funding to Metis Locals

Purpose

To provide funding to Metis Locals in the Northwest Territories in the form of grants for core funding to assist with office operating costs.

Eligibility

Eligibility is restricted to community-based Metis organizations that are specifically listed within the Policy and are recognized as representing the local interests of Metis residents in the Northwest Territories along the Mackenzie Valley and around Great Slave Lake.

Amount

Maximum of \$13,235 annually.

NWT Arts Council Contributions

Purpose

NWT Arts Council Contributions support and encourage creative artistic projects in the visual, literary and performing arts and in new media in the Northwest Territories.

Eligibility

Eligibility is restricted to:

- (a) An artist (e.g., musician, writer, painter, actor, photographer, film maker, etc.) who has resided in the Northwest Territories for at least two years.
- (b) A cultural group established in the Northwest Territories with objectives to enhance or support the visual, literary, new media or performing arts.

Amount

Applicants for funding must be reviewed and recommended by the NWT Arts Council. Members of the NWT Arts Council must not benefit financially from any NWT Arts Council contributions.

- (a) Administration costs shall not exceed ten percent (10%) of the total contribution.
- (b) Capital costs shall not exceed ten percent (10%) of the total contribution (e.g., Props, sets, etc. for theatre productions).
- (c) Living allowances shall not exceed \$2,000 per month.

(d) Travel to display artwork will be considered an operating cost.

(e) All contributions are subject to the audit requirements of the Government of the Northwest Territories.

Aboriginal Languages Contributions

Purpose

Financial assistance is provided to Aboriginal organizations to support the preservation, maintenance, enhancement and revitalization of Aboriginal languages in the Northwest Territories.

Eligibility

Only the governing or corporate authorities representing each of the Northwest Territories' official Aboriginal languages, or their designates, are eligible to receive funding.

Amount

- (a) An annual allocation of \$50,000 (subject to availability of funding) for each Aboriginal language community; and
- (b) The remaining funds to be apportioned on a per capita basis for each Aboriginal language community.

Core Funding Contributions for the Operation of Registered Heritage Centres

Purpose

To provide financial assistance for the operation of Registered Heritage Centres.

Eligibility

Only those organizations included in the Department's Registry of Heritage Centres are eligible to apply for operational assistance.

Amount

- (a) The amount of funding is based on the demonstrated need of the organization and the number of organizations applying for funds as well as budget allocation as approved by the Legislative Assembly.
- (b) Eligible costs must not exceed funding limits set in accordance with paragraph (a) above.

Cultural Organizations Contributions

Purpose

To provide financial support for the administration and operation of organizations that undertake the maintenance, promotion and development of the arts and culture in the Northwest Territories.

Eligibility

Eligibility is restricted to not-for-profit organizations which are registered and in good standing under the *NWT Societies Act* and whose headquarters and primary location of operation is in the NWT. Preference is given, but not limited, to those organizations:

- (a) with a mandate to enhance cultural identity of northern residents;
- (b) which have clearly defined operating plans;
- (c) which have proven success in completing and sharing the results of cultural projects; and
- (d) which have demonstrated support from the group(s) which they represent.

Amount

The amount of funding is based on the demonstrated need of the organization and the number of organizations applying for funds as well as budget allocation as approved by the Legislative Assembly.

Cultural Projects Contributions

Purpose

The program provides financial assistance for the promotion and preservation of cultural identity and the enhancement of traditional cultures in the NWT.

Eligibility

Eligibility is restricted to:

- (a) Organizations, individuals, community governments and band councils with demonstrated interest in the promotion and enhancement of Northwest Territories' cultures.
- (b) Cultural events and projects that are primarily located outside of the Northwest Territories will not be considered for funding. Preference will be given, but not limited, to those applicants who have a diversified funding base and who attempt to strengthen traditional culture within a contemporary context.
- (c) For oral traditions projects, applicants must have written verification of community support for their research objectives. In order to receive funding, each recipient must be willing to acquire or to demonstrate their knowledge of interview and research skills, as well as to become familiar with the procedures used to store recordings.

Amount

The amount of funding is based on the demonstrated need of the applicant and the number of applicants for funding as well as budget allocation as approved by the Legislative Assembly:

- (a) total financial assistance will not exceed \$20,000 per year per individual or organization; and

- (b) total financial assistance for researchers from outside of the Northwest Territories will not exceed 25 percent of the total program budget.

French Language Development – Community Cultural Development Program

Purpose

Financial assistance is provided to the Federation Franco-TeNOise to administer contributions for community-based initiatives which support the cultural development of the Francophone community in the Northwest Territories.

Eligibility

Eligibility is restricted to the Federation Franco-TeNOise.

Amount

- (a) The contribution amount will include allocation of funds for operating expenses which do not exceed 10% of the total contribution.

- (b) The maximum amounts for the contribution will be based on the amounts secured through The Canada – NWT Cooperation Agreement for French and Aboriginal Languages in the NWT and designated for this specific purpose.

Support to Northern Performers

Purpose

Financial contributions are provided for development and promotion of performing arts in the Northwest Territories and for assisting performing artists of the Northwest Territories to participate in local and regional public festivals and events.

Eligibility

Organizations, community governments, band councils, territorial festival organizations and performing artists who have resided in the Northwest Territories for a minimum of two years.

Amount

The amount of funding is based on the demonstrated need of the organization and the number of organizations applying for funds as well as budget allocation as approved by the Legislative Assembly.

Community Museums (Improvement to Buildings)

Purpose

To provide financial assistance to organizations actively involved in the preservation, portrayal and promotion of heritage in the Northwest Territories, for repairs and upgrades to community museums and heritage facilities.

Financial assistance is available for assessments, repairs or capital improvements to, or planning studies for:

- (1) community museums; and
- (2) heritage facilities.

Eligibility

Eligibility for this program is restricted to NWT-registered societies, local governments or not-for-profit corporations whose mandates include the ongoing delivery of heritage programs.

Preference will be given to:

- (1) Requests from registered heritage centers for assistance with repairing or upgrading facilities that maintain and preserve established collections. Registered heritage centres are only those community-based heritage facilities that meet the criteria outlined in Section 6.11 of the Heritage Services Policy available from the Department of Education, Culture and Employment; and

- (2) Projects that demonstrate funding from other sources and/or support-in-kind.

Amount

Subject to the availability of funding, a maximum amount of \$60,000 per project is available under this program.

The Culture, Heritage and Languages Division will recommend to the appropriate authority the amount of the contribution, recognizing that the amount of funding is based on the demonstrated need of the organization and the number of organizations applying for funds as well as an approved budget allocation for the Department of Education, Culture and Employment.

Grants to Non-Profit Organizations for Special Projects

Purpose

To provide one-time-only funding for Special Projects that support the cultural, economic, political and social participation of women in society.

Special Projects may include, but are not limited to: workshops, conferences, publications, life skills development and support to organizations involved in these activities.

Eligibility

Eligibility is restricted to societies, governments, and community organizations which represent the interests of women. Funding is limited to Special Projects that enhance the status of women.

Amount

As determined by the Minister on recommendation of the Special Advisor, to a maximum of \$5,000.

Department of Municipal and Community Affairs

Recreation and Sport Contributions Program

Purpose

To assist community governments, and regional or territorial-based not-for-profit organizations in the delivery of recreation and sport programs.

Eligibility

Community governments are eligible for funding for the following recreation and sport activities:

- (a) Participation, development or delivery of recreation and sport activities including traditional aboriginal events;
- (b) Development and delivery of public aquatic programs;
- (c) Development of resources that promote recreation and sport participation including web-based activity; and
- (d) Development and delivery of recreation and sport skill clinics or workshops;
- (e) Improvements to local recreation and sport programs and services;
- (f) To obtain sport and recreation equipment for public programs; and
- (g) To develop sport and recreation plans (multi-year facility, event hosting, strategic plans, program development plans).

Not-for-profit regional or territorial organizations registered in the Northwest Territories are eligible for funding for the following activities:

- (a) Participation in regional, territorial, national or international recreation and sport events, including travel;
- (b) Development of sport and recreation organizations, including annual conferences, general meetings and strategic planning;
- (c) Development of resources that promote recreation and sport participation, including web-based activity;
- (d) Research activities;
- (e) Initiatives aimed at increasing the number of participants and leaders in recreation and sport activities;

(f) Hosting regional, territorial, national and international recreation and sporting events;

(g) Awards and recognition programs; and

(h) Administrative expense (maximum of 15%).

Amount

The range available for community governments is \$14,000 to \$80,000 depending on population and northern cost index.

The maximum amount available to a not-for-profit organization is \$150,000 per fiscal year.

Assistance for Regional Leadership Meetings

Purpose

To assist, on a cost-shared basis, with travel, accommodation, meals and translation costs for elected community leaders to attend regional leadership meetings.

Eligibility

Funding is limited to the travel expenses of elected community leaders, or their appointed representatives, including but not limited to elected heads of municipal corporations, Metis Locals, or aboriginal community organizations arising from comprehensive land claim agreements

Amount

Funding provided will be cost-shared with the regional organization at Government of the Northwest Territories rates.

Contributions for Community Organized Searches

Purpose

To support community organized searches for missing persons.

Eligibility

- (a) When a community government determines that circumstances warrant a search for a missing person or persons prior to the commencement of or after the conclusion of a public search, the Deputy Minister may provide a contribution to support the community organized search when:
- i. The community has consulted with the Royal Canadian Mounted Police and has determined that a public search is not currently underway;
 - ii. The community government makes an official request to the Deputy Minister to approve a community organized search; and
 - iii. The Deputy Minister authorizes the community organized search under the *Civil Emergency Measures Act*.
- (b) Where there is no recognized community government, the Deputy Minister may provide a contribution to an appropriate group or organization.

Amount

Reimbursement of actual eligible expenses to a maximum of one thousand dollars.

Community Sport and Recreation Contributions

Purpose

To financially assist a community government or community-based recreation and sport organizations to provide sport and recreation in that community.

Eligibility

Community governments and not-for-profit community recreation or sport organizations are eligible for funding for the following activities and events:

- (a) Participation in northern recreation or sport events;
- (b) Development and delivery of sport and recreation activities, including traditional aboriginal sport and recreation activities;
- (c) Development and delivery of a public aquatics program;
- (d) Promotion of, and development of resources for, recreation and sport activities, including the development of internet web sites;
- (e) Development and delivery of recreation or sport skills workshops or clinics;
- (f) Improvements to local recreation and sport programs and services;
- (g) To obtain recreation and sport equipment for public programs; and
- (h) To develop sport and recreation plans (multi-year facility, event hosting, strategic plans, program development plans, etc.).

Amount

Maximum of \$80,000 per community for all sport and recreation programs.

Purpose

Eligible Northwest Territories community governments and band councils which do not receive funding under the Water and Sewer Services Subsidy Policy. Eligible community governments are identified in Appendix A of the policy.

Amount

Funding partially covers the costs of water delivery and waste pickup services.

NWT Organizations Providing Assistance to Community Governments

Purpose

To support Northwest Territories organizations with a mandate to assist community governments through research, information sharing, coordination and other support services.

Eligibility

Not-for-profit, territorial organizations, including but not limited to:

Contributions for Pilot or Demonstration Projects

Hunters' and Trappers' Disaster Compensation

Purpose

To assist harvesters who sustain substantial financial losses due to unavoidable natural disasters such as forest fires or severe storms.

Eligibility

Residents of the Northwest Territories who:

- (a) hold a General Hunting License or are land claim beneficiaries;
- (b) are regularly and actively engaged in renewable resource harvesting activities; and
- (c) earned at least 25% of gross income from renewable resource harvesting for the period of 12 months immediately prior to the incident.

Compensation will not be made for losses due to carelessness or poor judgment.

For damages or losses from forest fires, harvesters, including their dependents may be eligible for:

- (a) a maximum of \$15,000 for relocation costs;
- (b) a maximum of \$7,000 to replace a cabin; and
- (c) a maximum of \$15,000 for replacement of other capital items.

For damage or loss from natural disasters other than forest fires, maximum compensation to individual harvesters, including their dependents, shall not exceed \$4,500 per occurrence.

Aboriginal Rights Court Challenges

Purpose

- (c) In complex cases, funding may be authorized in excess of the maximum set out in paragraph (a) above.
- (d) Partial funding may be granted in cases which are only in part eligible for funding under this program.
