INTRODUCTION

This Handbook provides information on the membership of public committees, boards and councils in the Northwest Territories, as appointed in whole or in part by the Legislative Assembly, the Executive Council, a Minister or the Commissioner, and is meant as an accessible directory of these boards.

The Handbook also provides information on some committees, boards and councils established by authorities other than the Government of the Northwest Territories (GNWT), to which the GNWT either nominates members or delegates specific responsibilities.

The Handbook is published periodically by the Cabinet Secretariat, Department of Executive, Government of the Northwest Territories. The current revision was compiled in July 2011 using information solicited from Government departments and, in some cases, from the boards themselves.

Though accurate at the time of revision, board membership changes constantly as terms expire, members resign and vacant positions are filled. Inquiries concerning latest board membership should be directed to the information contact given for each board.

The authority under which each agency acts varies, and is specified for each listing, along with a description of its function, what category it is in, who appoints members, and who the agency reports to.

The following information pertains to boards over which the Government of the Northwest Territories has jurisdiction.

The categories into which a board may fall are:

- advisory,
- regulatory or complex, or
- complex regulated commercial.

All boards fall into the "advisory" category unless they have been otherwise classified by the Executive Council. Classification as other than "advisory" depends upon several factors. They are:

- complexities of judgment are present requiring special qualifications or technical expertise;
- decisions are made with limited precedent; and
- consequences of decisions are large in dollars, resources or human terms

Honorariums are paid to members based on classification.

All GNWT public boards are subject to the provisions contained in the *Financial Administration Act* and the Government of the Northwest Territories Financial Administration Manual.

APPOINTMENT PROCEDURES

RESPONSIBILITY

The final appointment authority for boards and agencies varies with the legislation or policy under which the board or agency was formed. The Minister responsible may appoint members to a board where that authority has been specified in the legislation or policy establishing it. In other instances, the Executive Council or Commissioner must approve appointments. The governing instrument should be referred to in each case.

NOMINATION PROCEDURE

The Minister responsible is notified by the board chairperson that a vacancy will occur six weeks prior to the term expiring or at the time an unexpected vacancy occurs.

The Minister may seek suggestions for suitable candidates for board membership from:

- Colleagues
- MLAs
- Deputy Minister (who may request Regional Superintendents' input)
- Community and Regional Councils
- Chairperson of the board in question
- Other persons or agencies relevant to the board's activities

Nomination for appointment may be submitted by letter to the Minister responsible identifying the nominee and the nominator and listing the nominee's qualifications for the position. The information can be provided in the form of a cover letter and resume, but should emphasize the strengths and abilities of the nominee particular to the board seat in question.

Some seats are to be filled by individuals from particular communities or groups, or are otherwise limited. Every effort is made so that the appointment reflects the population served by the board in question. Technical knowledge is important, but there is also a need for lay representation. Consideration is given to life experience, traditional knowledge, aboriginal identity, gender, place and duration of residence, involvement in community activities and work experience.

The Deputy Minister will advise persons making the nomination of any particular qualifications the board appointee should have. Any information supporting the nominations should be provided in the letter of nomination or attached resume.

The names will be compiled by a person designated by the Minister (usually the Deputy Minister or equivalent position).

Candidates identified by the Minister as suitable and qualified for a particular board shall be screened by the Deputy Minister for potential conflicts of interest as defined in the *Conflict of interest Act*. The Deputy Minister will then contact nominees selected by the Minister to ensure they are willing to participate on the board in question and understand the duties and responsibilities of the position.

If the Minister or Commissioner has the authority to make the appointment, an information item is prepared by the Minister and submitted to the Executive Council.

Community level committees may be appointed without going through the above nominating procedure, (e.g. Community Social Assistance Appeal Committees). These appointments, however, must follow the legislated appointment procedures.

Once the meeting of the Executive Council takes place with the information item on the agenda, and there are no objections or specific direction given to the contrary, the Minister takes the appropriate steps to make the appointment as specified under the section on appointment procedures below.

If the Executive Council has the authority to make the appointment, the item should be submitted for Executive Council consideration in a decision paper format with the information, as listed above for an information item, included. Should Cabinet approval of the nomination be given, a record of decision is issued.

In some instances, the Legislative Assembly must approve nominations prior to the appointment being made. Where a formal Executive Council nomination is to be forwarded to the Legislative Assembly, the nomination may be obtained by means of a decision paper.

APPOINTMENT PROCEDURE

For Boards Created through Legislation

After the proposed appointment has appeared as an information item on the Executive Council agenda or an appointment has been approved by Executive Council and a record of decision issued or the Legislative Assembly has confirmed appointments as required by Legislation, the chairperson of the board is contacted by the Minister and advised of the appointment.

The Deputy Minister of the department providing administrative support or who deals with that board, obtains the necessary forms (Attached as Annex A) from the Legislation Division, Department of Justice, and provides the necessary information to prepare the appointment.

The Legislation Division prepares the appointment on the appropriate instrument for signature by the Minister or Commissioner as specified in the Legislation creating the board or agency. It is this instrument which makes the appointment official.

Although statutory requirements may call for the Commissioner to sign the instrument prepared by the Legislation Division, it is normal practice for the Minister responsible to make the official notification of the appointment by means of a letter from the Minister to the appointee.

The Legislation Division registers the instrument and publishes it in the NWT Gazette.

For Boards Created through Policy

Where the individual Minister has appointment authority, a letter from the Minister makes the appointment official after the appointment has appeared as an information item on the Executive Council agenda.

Where the Executive Council has appointment authority, a record of decision is required to make the appointment official. In this case the letter from the Minister responsible serves as notification of the appointment.

For consistency with appointments made for organizations created through Legislation, the appointment form attached as Annex B should be completed, signed by the Minister responsible, and forwarded to the Legislation Division for publication in the NWT Gazette.

The Minister's authority would be noted as either the meeting number where the item appeared as an information item in the case where the Minister has authority, or the Record of Decision number in the case where the Executive Council has authority for the appointment. Although publication of board appointments in the NWT Gazette is not a legal requirement, it provides a single reference source for all appointments made by the Government of the Northwest Territories.

JUDICIAL APPOINTMENTS ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Function

Under s. 5.3(7) and (8) of the *Territorial Court Act*, the Committee's function is to make recommendations to the Commissioner in Executive Council respecting the appointment of territorial judges. In performing its duties, the Committee shall advertise the vacancy and review all applications, conducting that process in accordance with criteria established by the Committee; assess the qualifications of the candidates; and in confidence give the Commissioner in Executive Council a ranked list of the candidates it recommends with brief supporting reasons. Similarly, under s.6 of the Act, the Committee makes recommendations to the Commissioner with respect to deputy territorial judges.

(a) the Chief Judge and the next most senior territorial judge;

- (b) two members of the Law Society of the Northwest Territories appointed by that body;
- (c) four persons appointed by the Commissioner in Executive Council who are neither judges nor members or former members of a law society in Canada; and
- (d) where the Chief Judge decides not to serve as a member of the Advisory Committee under paragraph (1)(a), the Chief Judge shall designate another Territorial judge as a member of the Advisory Committee.

JUDICIAL COUNCIL FOR TERRITORIAL JUDGES

Function

The functions of the Council are to receive and investigate any complaint made against a territorial court judge. The Council may refer any complaint to the Chief Judge or to a mediator. The Council may decide to hold a formal hearing, and has the powers of a board of inquiry under the *Public Inquiries Act*. Any such hearing is open to the public unless there are exceptional circumstances. After a hearing, the Council may impose a warning, a reprimand or suspension with or without pay, or may recommend removal from office.
