Purpose

To provide funding to Metis Locals in the Northwest Territories in the form of grants for core funding to assist with office operating costs.

Eligibility

Eligibility is restricted to community-based Metis organizations that are specifically listed within the Policy and are recognized as representing the local interests of Metis residents in the Northwest Territories along the Mackenzie Valley and around Great Slave Lake.

Amount

Maximum of \$13,235 annually.

Purpose

To provide funding to territorial, regional and/or community Aboriginal organizations to supplement the costs of annual general assemblies, special assemblies, the public celebration of National Aboriginal Day, and other special events as approved from time to time by the Minister.

Eligibility

- (a) for the purposes of annual or special assemblies, the following territorial and regional Aboriginal organizations are eligible:
 - Inuvialuit Regional Corporation
 - Dene Nation
 - Gwich'in Tribal Council
 - Sahtu Secretariat Incorporated
 - Tlicho Government
 - Deh Cho First Nations
 - Akaitcho Dene First Nations
 - North Slave Metis Alliance
 - Northwest Territories Metis Nation
 - Native Women's Association
 - As approved by the Minister, other Aboriginal organizations, duly registered and in good standing under the *Societies Act*.

- (b) for the purposes of National Aboriginal Day, community Aboriginal organizations that represent the political, social and cultural interests of their members and are duly registered and in good standing under the *Societies Act*.

- (c) for the purposes of other special events, as approved from time to time by the Minister, those organizations listed under (a) and referred to under (b).

Amount

- (a) not exceeding \$5,000 to each eligible territorial or regional Aboriginal organization to supplement the costs of annual or special assemblies; and

- (b) not exceeding \$1,000 to each eligible community Aboriginal organization for public celebration of National Aboriginal Day.

Purpose

Financial assistance is provided to Aboriginal organizations to support the preservation, maintenance, enhancement and revitalization of Aboriginal languages in the Northwest Territories.

Eligibility

Only the governing or corporate authorities representing each of the Northwest Territories' official Aboriginal languages, or their designates, are eligible to receive funding.

Amount

- (a) An annual allocation of \$50,000 (subject to availability of funding) for each Aboriginal language community; and
- (b) The remaining funds to be apportioned on a per capita basis for each Aboriginal language community.

Purpose

To provide financial assistance to organizations actively involved in the preservation, portrayal and promotion of heritage in the Northwest Territories, for repairs and upgrades to community museums and heritage facilities.

Financial assistance is available for assessments, repairs or capital improvements to, or planning studies for:

- (1) community museums; and
- (2) heritage facilities.

Eligibility

Eligibility for this program is restricted to NWT-registered societies, local governments or not-for-profit corporations whose mandates include the ongoing delivery of heritage programs.

Preference will be given to:

- (1) Requests from registered heritage centers for assistance with repairing or upgrading facilities that maintain and preserve established collections. Registered heritage centres are only those community-based heritage facilities that meet the criteria outlined in Section 6.11 of the Heritage Services Policy available from the Department of Education, Culture and Employment; and
- (2) Projects that demonstrate funding from other sources and/or support-in-kind.

Amount

Subject to the availability of funding, a maximum amount of \$50,000 per project is available under this program.

The Culture and Heritage Division will recommend to the appropriate authority the amount of the contribution, recognizing that the amount of funding is based on the demonstrated need of the organization and the number of organizations applying for funds as well as an approved budget allocation for the Department of Education, Culture and Employment.

Purpose

To provide financial assistance for the operation of Registered Heritage Centres.

Eligibility

Only those organizations included in the Department's Registry of Heritage Centres are eligible to apply for operational assistance.

Amount

- (a) The amount of funding is based on the demonstrated need of the organization and the number of organizations applying for funds as well as budget allocation as approved by the Legislative Assembly.
- (b) Eligible costs must not exceed funding limits set in accordance with paragraph (a) above.

Purpose

To provide financial support for the administration and operation of organizations that undertake the maintenance, promotion and development of the arts and culture in the Northwest Territories.

Eligibility

Eligibility is restricted to not-for-profit organizations which are registered and in good standing under the *NWT Societies Act* and whose headquarters and primary location of operation is in the NWT. Preference is given, but not limited, to those organizations:

- (a) with a mandate to enhance cultural identity of northern residents;
- (b) which have clearly defined operating plans;
- (c) which have proven success in completing and sharing the results of cultural projects; and
- (d) which have demonstrated support from the group(s) which they represent.

Amount

The amount of funding is based on the demonstrated need of the organization and the number of organizations applying for funds as well as budget allocation as approved by the Legislative Assembly.

Purpose

The program provides financial assistance for the promotion and preservation of cultural identity and the enhancement of traditional cultures in the NWT.

Eligibility

Eligibility is restricted to:

- (a) Organizations, individuals, community governments and band councils with demonstrated interest in the promotion and enhancement of Northwest Territories' cultures.
- (b) Cultural events and projects that are primarily located outside of the Northwest Territories will not be considered for funding. Preference will be given, but not limited, to those applicants who have a diversified funding base and who attempt to strengthen traditional culture within a contemporary context.
- (c) For oral traditions projects, applicants must have written verification of community support for their research objectives. In order to receive funding, each recipient must be willing to acquire or to demonstrate their knowledge of interview and research skills, as well as to become familiar with the procedures used to store recordings.

Amount

The amount of funding is based on the demonstrated need of the applicant and the number of applicants for funding as well as budget allocation as approved by the Legislative Assembly:

- (a) total financial assistance will not exceed \$20,000 per year per individual or organization; and
- (b) total financial assistance for researchers from outside of the Northwest Territories will not exceed 25 percent of the total program budget.

Purpose

Financial assistance is provided to the Federation Franco-TeNOise to administer contributions for community-based initiatives which support the cultural development of the Francophone community in the Northwest Territories.

Eligibility

Eligibility is restricted to the Federation Franco-TeNOise.

Amount

- (a) The contribution amount will include allocation of funds for operating expenses which do not exceed 10% of the total contribution.
- (b) The maximum amounts for the contribution will be based on the amounts secured through The Canada – NWT Cooperation Agreement for French and Aboriginal Languages in the NWT and designated for this specific purpose.

Purpose

NWT Arts Council Contributions support and encourage creative artistic projects in the visual, literary and performing arts and in new media in the Northwest Territories.

Eligibility

Eligibility is restricted to:

- (a) An artist (e.g., musician, writer, painter, actor, photographer, film maker, etc.) who has resided in the Northwest Territories for at least two years.
- (b) A cultural group established in the Northwest Territories with objectives to enhance or support the visual, literary, new media or performing arts.

Amount

Applicants for funding must be reviewed and recommended by the NWT Arts Council. Members of the NWT Arts Council must not benefit financially from any NWT Arts Council contributions.

- (a) Administration costs shall not exceed ten percent (10%) of the total contribution.
- (b) Capital costs shall not exceed ten percent (10%) of the total contribution (e.g., Props, sets, etc. for theatre productions).
- (c) Living allowances shall not exceed \$2,000 per month.
- (d) Travel to display artwork will be considered an operating cost.
- (e) All contributions are subject to the audit requirements of the Government of the Northwest Territories.

Purpose

Financial contributions are provided for development and promotion of performing arts in the Northwest Territories and for assisting performing artists of the Northwest Territories to participate in local and regional public festivals and events.

Eligibility

Organizations, community governments, band councils, territorial festival organizations and performing artists who have resided in the Northwest Territories for a minimum of two years.

Amount

The amount of funding is based on the demonstrated need of the organization or artist and the number of organizations or artists applying for funds as well as budget allocation as approved by the Legislative Assembly.

Purpose

Contributions are available to assist in conserving electricity, fuel and water.

Eligibility

Territorial and municipal funded departments, boards and agencies, and non-profit organizations.

Amount

Applicants may receive up to 50% of eligible project costs. The maximum funding available for any project is five times the anticipated annual savings in dollars, up to a maximum of \$50,000.

Purpose

A grant is available to assist harvesters who sustain damage or loss resulting from forest fires.

Eligibility

Residents of the Northwest Territories who hold General Hunting Licences or are land claim beneficiaries and who are dependent on renewable resources for a significant portion of their income. For compensation relating to damages from forest fires, harvesters must earn at least 25% of their income from harvesting to be eligible.

Amount

Harvesters may receive assistance to a maximum of \$15,000 to establish a new fur harvesting area similar in size to the area burned. A harvester will also be eligible for a maximum of \$7,000 to replace a cabin and a maximum of \$15,000 for other eligible capital items.

Genuine Mackenzie Valley Fur Program

(a) Advance

The Genuine Mackenzie Valley Fur (GMVF) advance program provides guaranteed advances to trappers delivering prime fur for sale through the GMVF program. Advances are based largely on anticipated market performance.

(b) Prime Fur Bonus

If the trapper's fur is sold for the same value or more than the advance, the trapper is entitled to receive a Prime Fur Bonus. The bonus payment recognizes that the fur is in good condition and has been well handled by the trapper.

(c) Fall Grub Stake

A trapper must harvest 20 or more pelts, to a maximum of 200 pelts of any species in the GMVF program to receive a payment (minimum \$100; maximum of \$1,000).

The GMVF marketing program also pays for all commissions, shipping and handling fees for fur shipped to auction.

Trappers who choose to ship their fur outside the GMVF program are entitled to the same benefits with the exception that no advance will be issued.

Purpose

To provide funding to community governments to assist with the provision of community government services and infrastructure.

Eligibility

Eligibility provisions of the Community Government Funding Policy are articulated further in three supporting policies:

Formula-Based Funding: community governments established under NWT legislation or the Band Councils that provide municipal services are eligible for funding under the Community Government Funding Policy.

Municipal Infrastructure Funding: All non-tax-based community governments that receive funding under the Community Government Funding Policy are allocated funds on an unconditional basis. Community governments set their own priorities for funding municipal programs and services, including municipal infrastructure funding for the planning and delivery of municipal infrastructure projects.

Extraordinary Funding: Community governments established under NWT legislation or the Band Councils that provide municipal services are eligible for funding under the Extraordinary Funding Policy.

Amount

Formula-Based Funding: Available funding is proportionally allocated to eligible community governments.

Municipal Infrastructure Funding: The Department of Municipal and Community Affairs does not provide additional funding specifically for municipal infrastructure projects, other than if a municipal infrastructure project is required on an emergency basis (i.e. public health or safety reasons).

Extraordinary Funding: The Department of Municipal and Community Affairs may provide extraordinary funding to a community government when an unforeseen situation arises in the operation of the community government requiring funding that is additional to normal requirements; and Extraordinary Funding contributions are allocated with the intent to resolve the unforeseen situation within one or two years. Funding amounts provided are dependent on the nature of the extraordinary funding request.

Purpose

To encourage and support community governments involved in the development of programs that address community priorities in the areas of families and youth, healthy lifestyles and safety education with a special emphasis on active living.

Eligibility

Non-taxed-based community governments or community-supported organizations in those communities are eligible for funding for the following expenses and activities:

- (a) Minor capital recreation projects including but not limited to above-ground swimming pools, outdoor skating rinks, parks, playgrounds, trails and sport fields;

- (a) Development of youth-related organizations, including annual general meetings and conferences as well as the development of strategic plans for the organization;
- (b) Initiatives aimed at the development of youth programs or specific events;
- (c) Promotion and development of resources for youth activities; and
- (d) Research into relevant youth topics.

Amount

- (a) Approved projects held within the Northwest Territories can receive a maximum of 75% of eligible expenses to the maximums outlined below. Approved projects held outside the Northwest Territories can receive a maximum of 50% of eligible expenses to the maximums outlined below.

Maximums are as follows: the maximum amount of any contribution agreement with a territorial organization is \$40,000. The maximum amount of any contribution agreement with a regional organization is \$20,000 and the maximum amount to any community organization or community government is \$5,000.

- (b) Funding is only available for the participation of youth and an appropriate number of chaperons.

- (c) Applications must be received three weeks in advance of the intended start date of the project.
- (d) Funding will only be provided to one group in a community for a given project in each fiscal year.
- (e) Expenses related to the conduct of fundraising events are not eligible.
