**Notice Informing NorZinc that the Conditions from the Approval of the Wildlife Management and Monitoring Plan for Phase 1 of the Prairie Creek All-season Road Project have been met**

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In a letter dated October 27, 2017, the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (ENR) informed Canadian Zinc (CZN; now NorZinc) that they were required under Section 95 of the *Wildlife Act* to submit a Wildlife Management and Monitoring Plan (WMMP) for the Prairie Creek all-season access road project for approval by the Minister of ENR.

The draft WMMP for the project has undergone several reviews and updates throughout the environmental assessment (EA) and post-EA regulatory phase conducted by the Mackenzie Valley Land and Water Board (MVLWB). This process has provided ENR and other parties with several opportunities to comment on the WMMP, and for NorZinc to respond to those comments.

On July 15, 2022, NorZinc submitted a revised version of the Phase 1 WMMP to ENR and Parks Canada for approval. On August 10, 2022, after a final review, ENR issued an approval with three conditions that were to be met 30 days prior to commencing construction of the Pioneer Winter Road. On October 5, 2022 NorZinc submitted a revised version of the WMMP which included amendments to address the approval conditions.

This letter is to notify NorZinc that the three approval conditions outlined in Attachment 1 have been satisfied. The October 2022 Version of the WMMP is now considered the final approved WMMP for the Prairie Creek all-season access road project and will be posted to ENR's website.

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ENR would like to remind NorZinc that the approved October 2022 version of the WMMP is binding and enforceable under the *Wildlife Act*. It is NorZinc's responsibility to meet the commitments and timelines identified in the WMMP.

## **Reasons for Decision - Approval of the Prairie Creek All Season Road: Phase 1 – Pioneer Winter Road Wildlife Management and Monitoring Plan**

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The July 2022 Version of the Prairie Creek All Season Road: Phase 1 – Pioneer Winter Road was approved with three conditions.

**Condition #1:** NorZinc shall update Section 8.1.2.1 to reflect the addition of a follow-up survey in August 2023.

*Section 8.1.2.1 and text throughout the WMMP reflect the addition of a collared pika monitoring survey in August 2023.*

**NorZinc has satisfied Condition #1.**

**Condition #2:** NorZinc shall amend Section 7.4 and SOP #1 of the WMMP to clarify that reporting of wildlife-vehicle collisions within 24 hrs extends to any project-related vehicle either traveling on the Pioneer Winter Road or an NWT highway. Wildlife-vehicle collisions involving project-related vehicles on NWT highways should also be summarized in annual WMMP reports.

*Section 7.4 and SOP #1 of the WMMP were revised to clarify that any project-related collisions with wildlife when traveling on the Pioneer Winter Road or an NWT highway will be reported within 24 hours.*

**NorZinc has satisfied Condition #2.**

**Condition #3:** NorZinc shall amend SOP #1 REPORTING, RESPONDING TO, AND DETERRING WILDLIFE to remove euthanization as a response when wildlife are encountered from Table 1 and Section 5.1.1 on territorial lands.

*NorZinc has amended Table 1 and Section 5.1.1 of SOP #1 so that the decision to euthanize critically injured or sick animals will be made by ENR on territorial lands.*

**NorZinc has satisfied Condition #3.**
